
COURSEWORK/HOMEWORK

ELA homework will reinforce class instruction, and some homework will provide preparation for the day to come. Class work not completed during class will be homework. Students can expect a small amount (15-30 minutes) of homework on a daily basis, specifically in the area of independent reading. All homework will be graded on mastery and accuracy, but extra attention will be paid to critical thought. ELA coursework will include in-class activities, homework, quizzes, tests, presentations, and projects. Ample notice will be given so that students will be aware of upcoming tests and projects.

Parents are encouraged to check **Skyward Parent Access** weekly to check on child's grades in EVERY class.

FORMATIVE

Summative grades are weighted 70% and include tests, projects, and final writing assignments.

Formative grades are weighted 30% and include homework, daily work, writing checkpoints, journal assignments, and presentations.

**Quizzes will count as double-weighted

formative (60%).



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LATE / INCOMPLETE WORK



Formative Assignments: Students will have two-days after the due date to turn in assignments for a maximum grade of a 70%. After that two-day window, students will receive a zero in the grade book.

Summative Assignments: Students will lose points for each day late a project or final written paper is turned in after the due date.

ABSENTEE POLICY

Formative Assignments: Students have one day for each day they were absent to make up the assignment.

Summative Assignments: Students will have a one-day window to make up a test. Projects that were assigned prior to the student's absence are due upon returning to school.
